learned in a data driven manner chapters 6 through 9 explore how different models from probability and statistics are applied to machine learning perhaps the most important tool that bridges the gap from data to probability is maximum likelihood estimation which is a foundational concept from the perspective of machine learning this concept is explored repeatedly in these chapters 3 advanced topics chapter 10 is devoted to discrete state markov processes it explores the application of probability and statistics to a temporal and sequential setting although the applications extend to more complex settings such as graphical data chapter 11 covers a number of probabilistic inequalities and approximations the style of writing promotes the learning of probability and statistics simultaneously with a probabilistic perspective on the modeling of machine learning applications the book contains over 200 worked examples in order to elucidate key concepts exercises are included both within the text of the chapters and at the end of the chapters the book is written for a broad audience including graduate students researchers and practitioners
