this book the first cross cultural study of post 1970s anglophone canadian and american multi ethnic drama invites assessment of the thematic and aesthetic contributions of this theater in today s globalized culture a growing number of playwrights of african south and east asian and first nations heritage have engaged with manifold socio political and aesthetic issues in experimental works combining formal features of more classical european dramatic traditions with such elements of ethnic culture as ancestral music and dance to interrogate the very concepts of theatricality and canonicity their mouths on fire august wilson these playwrights contest stereotyped notions of authenticity in spired by songs of anger passion experience survival and regeneration the plays analyzed bespeak a burning desire to break the silence to heal and empower
