a two volume set intended for readers interested in understanding the political and cultural underpinnings of socioeconomic inequality across the globe inequality around the world examines key drivers and shapers of inequality at the local national and international level the two volume set includes 33 in depth chapters covering such issues as public and private healthcare environmental protection and pollution housing disability women s rights land policies antisemitism sexual orientation and gender diversity race and racism political representation and access to higher education each chapter compares and contrasts conditions in major countries including the usa russia india china and germany as well as in wider regions like the middle east west africa central america and eastern europe scrupulously researched and wide ranging in coverage inequality around the world provides an in depth survey of socioeconomic inequality in the 21st century in all its many forms

this report examines how students especially those with high abilities choose a college based on information from four areas 1 published research comparing various schools subjects as well as some unpublished comparative data from various sources 2 young adult fiction that deals with issues related to college choice 3 media accounts of college admission and college choice and 4 conversations with other students in the process of choosing colleges the report discusses the basis for the choices made by students the other people who influence choice what students and parents want to know about colleges and what they already know and the financial and psychological costs associated with getting into college the book concludes with observations about what is really known about college choice decisions the problems with students sources of information behavioral considerations and a discussion of some of the public interest and policy questions needing to be addressed contains 86 references glr

in this book dane s claussen argues that the news media have fed vocationalism and self doubt in higher education and anti intellectualism throughout american culture analyzing articles in

popular national magazines since the GI Bill of 1944 Claussen finds that media have overwhelmingly portrayed college as a time and place for students to play sports date and marry drink and take drugs protest join fraternities and sororities go on vacations avoid the draft escape their parents and perhaps most of all network and find jobs in short do almost anything except research study write think or debate in the tradition of Richard Hofstadter's Pulitzer Prize winning *Anti-Intellectualism in American Life* and Allan Bloom's *Closing of the American Mind* Claussen illustrates the counterintuitive and underestimated nearly overlooked role of the news media in higher education and anti-intellectualism
