as the first volume of a two volume set that examines the interaction between social transformation and visual culture in contemporary china this book explores the visual construction of popular culture avant garde art and grassroots media culture drawing on an approach of marxist historic materialism and academic resources of sociology communication and art this study of contemporary china s visual culture emphasizes two inter related aspects the visual construction of society and the social construction of the visual it seeks to unravel how visual culture is produced and constructed as well as how it reflects the profound social transformation and reshapes people s understanding and experience of modernization in this volume the contributors revisit popular culture avant garde art and grassroots media culture in contemporary china analyzing the visual image and representation and visual culture s role in social construction in doing so the book also reveals the cultural tension of contemporary china in which the visual aspect figures prominently this book will serve as an essential read for scholars and students of china studies and cultural studies as well as all levels of readers interested in visual culture in contemporary china

explores new critical approaches to a history of representation seen as something different from a history of art

this reader brings together for the first time key writings about the nineteenth century a key period in contemporary discussion of visual culture exploring such topics as photographs exhibitions and advertising the editors suggest that modernity rather than modernism is a valuable way of understanding the changes particular to the visual culture of the time and they investigate a variety of nineteenth century images technologies and visual experiences with three specially written essays about definitions of visual culture as an object of study the book examines genealogies and introduces key writings about culture from writers living in the nineteenth century itself or from those who scrutinized its visual culture from early in the twentieth century such as walter benjamin and siegfried kracauer the nineteenth century visual culture reader is organized around key themes technologies of vision practices of display and the circulation of images cities and the built environment visual representations of the past visual representations of catagories of racial sexual and social differences spatial configurations of inside and out private and public selections include well known authors and new research by younger scholars to produce a well balanced and comprehensive collection

what is art history why how and where did it originate and how have its methods changed over time the history of art has been written and rewritten since classical antiquity since the foundation of the modern discipline of art history in germany in the late eighteenth century debates about art and its histories have intensified historians philosophers psychologists and anthropologists among others have changed our notions of what art history has been is and might be this anthology is a guide to understanding art history through critical reading of the field s most innovative and influential texts focusing on the past two centuries each section focuses on a key issue art as history aesthetics form content and style anthropology meaning and interpretation authorship and identity and the phenomenon of globalization more than thirty readings from writers as diverse as winckelmann kant mary

kelly and michel foucault are brought together with editorial introductions to each topic providing background information bibliographies and critical elucidations of the issues at stake this updated and expanded edition contains sixteen newly included extracts from key thinkers in the history of art from giorgio vasari to walter benjamin and satya mohanty a new section on globalization and also a new concluding essay from donald preziosi on the tasks of the art historian today

the author traces the history and theory of visual culture asking how and why visual media have become so central to contemporary everyday life he explores a wide range of visual forms including painting sculpture photography television cinema virtual reality and the internet while addressing the subjects of race ethnicity gender sexuality the body and the international media event that followed the death of princess diana

this collection explores the cultural fascination with social media forms of self portraiture selfies with a specific interest in online self imaging strategies in a western context this book examines the selfie as a social and technological phenomenon but also engages with digital self portraiture as representation as work that is committed to rigorous object based analysis the scholars in this volume consider the topic of online self portraiture both its social function as a technology driven form of visual communication as well as its thematic intellectual historical and aesthetic intersections with the history of art and visual culture this book will be of interest to scholars of photography art history and media studies

television video theatre performance computer imagery and virtual reality it is also about visual culture studies a relatively new academic discipline or rather range of disciplines that scholars employ to analyse visual artefacts unlike many other texts on the same subject it foregrounds the visual and is systematic and accessible visual culture provides an overview of the subject that pays heed to the achievements of both traditional and new theory whilst directing the reader to a large body of literature via references and an extensive bibliography walker and chaplin discuss the concepts of the visual and of culture as well as the field and origins of visual culture studies coping with theory models of production and consumption institutions pleasure the canon and concepts of value visual literacy and poetics modes of analysis culture and commerce and new technologies this book is designed for those studying the history and theory of fine arts design and the mass media

visual culture studies presents 13 engaging and detailed interviews with some of the most influential intellectuals working today on the objects subjects media and environments of visual culture exploring historical and theoretical questions of vision the visual and visuality this collection reveals the provocative insights of these thinkers as they have contributed in exhilarating ways to disturbing the parameters of more traditional areas of study across the arts humanities and social sciences in so doing they have key roles in establishing visual culture studies as a significant field of inquiry each interview draws out the interests and commitments of the interviewee to critically interrogate the past present and future possibilities of visual culture studies and visual culture itself the discussions concentrate on three broad areas of deliberation the intellectual and institutional status of visual culture studies the histories genealogies and archaeologies of visual culture and its study the diverse ways in which the experiences of vision and the visual can be articulated and mobilized to political aesthetic and ethical ends this book demonstrates the intellectual significance of visual culture studies and the ongoing importance of the study

this is a revised expanded and updated edition of the highly successful visual culture like its predecessor this new version is about visual literacy exploring how meaning is both made and transmitted in an increasingly visual world

it is designed to introduce students and other interested readers to the analysis of all kinds of visual text whether drawings paintings photographs films advertisements television or new media forms the book is illustrated with examples that range from medieval painting to contemporary advertising images and is written in a lively and engaging style the first part of the book takes the reader through differing theoretical approaches to visual analysis and includes chapters on iconology form art history ideology semiotics and hermeneutics the second part shifts from a theoretical to a medium based approach and comprises chapters on fine art photography film television and new media these chapters are connected by an underlying theme about the complex relationship between visual culture and reality new for the second edition are ten more theoretically advanced key debate sections which conclude each chapter by provoking readers to set off and think for themselves prominent among the new provocateurs are kant baudrillard althusser deleuze benjamin and foucault new examples and illustrations have also been added together with updated suggestions for further reading the book draws together seemingly diverse approaches while ultimately arguing for a polysemic approach to visual analysis building on the success of the first edition this new edition continues to provide an ideal introduction for students taking courses in visual culture and communications in a wide range of disciplines including media and cultural studies sociology art and design

this title argues that because we are so immersed in visual imagery we need to be able to engage with it critically the authors show in various ways that the visuality of contemporary culture can be seen as one of the primary carriers of ideas

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applying a feminist and international approach to the interwar years 1918-1939 this collection explores women's art in a variety of mediums including design print illustration murals poster art costume design film sculpture and painting these essays place a central concern on the history and theory of art and gender and have a coherent focus on women's role in the agency and mediation of artistic production between the wars

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
