a great fissure occurred in western civilization in the early modern period with the divorce between the humanities and the sciences and the rise of scientific naturalism the metaphysics of self and world is a philosophical exploration of the relationship between the individual the culture and the world it is in the author s words a philosophy of the humanities a philosophy of humanity and a philosophy of social reality it explores the implications of a world view that would integrate the

perspective of the sciences with humanistic ways of thought e m adams claims that we do violence to ourselves as human beings by trying to fit into the world as delineated in scientific categories rejecting cultural subjectivism and scientific naturalism he argues for the irreducibility and validity of the categories of the humanities and for a fully developed humanistic philosophy of self and world in generating this world view he utilizes the humanities as a source of culture therapy in order to close the fissure in western civilization author note e m adams is kenan professor of philosophy emeritus at the university of north carolina chapel hill he has written numerous books and articles and a festschrift celebrating his work mind value and culture essays in honor of e m adams edited by david weissbord was published in 1989

keith hossack presents an original approach to philosophy founded on the thesis that knowledge is an absolutely fundamental relation he takes knowledge as the key to understanding a wide range of issues in metaphysics philosophical logic and philosophy of mind and language

the thesis of this book is that williams played a key role in the development and revival of analytic metaphysics this book begins with an account of williams approach to philosophy given the rise of realism in the early twentieth century with a focus on his use of induction and parsimony to argue for metaphysical theses such as metaphysical realism and metaphysical naturalism it explains his critique of logical positivism and his defence of an empirical conception of metaphysics which in turn reveals how he took himself to be standing up to rising anti metaphysical trends this book then expounds within the framework of his empirical metaphysics his one category trope ontology and its origins arguing that his systematisation of the concept of an abstract particular or trope is his most novel contribution to analytic ontology this book further presents an original interpretation of his account of concrete objects and abstract universals engaging with current debates in the metaphysics of properties sometimes defending williams sometimes correcting misinterpretations sometimes critically reassessing his views this book also explains his defence of the four dimensional manifold of time and his objections to competing theories such as the growing block theory and presentism incorporating recently posthumously published work in the elements and patterns of being ed a r j fisher 2018 with up to date references to the latest work in the metaphysics of time lastly this book analyses williams s influence on later philosophers such as lewis and armstrong and others in australia drawing from correspondence between williams lewis and armstrong and evaluates his place in the history of analytic philosophy concluding that he played a key role in the development and revival of analytic metaphysics

published in 1797 in königsberg by friedrich nicolovius the metaphysics of morals die metaphysik der sitten is immanuel kant s final major work on practical philosophy in which he presents a structured account of law and virtue grounded in the concept of freedom as the basis of right this 1797 publication is not to be confused with his early 1785 work groundwork for the metaphysics of morals which

is a different book distinct from his earlier critique of practical reason this work is divided into two main parts the doctrine of right *rechtslehre* dealing with external laws and coercible duties in the civil realm and the doctrine of virtue *tugendlehre* treating internal moral duties and ethical self formation it was conceived as the positive system of morals grounded in the pure principles laid out earlier in his critical ethics the doctrine of right sets out kant's theory of juridical law defining rights as conditions under which one's freedom can coexist with the freedom of others under a universal law it includes his defense of property contract the state and punishment all rooted in the idea that legal obligations must be capable of external enforcement in the doctrine of virtue kant turns to duties that cannot be imposed by force such as beneficence self respect and moral cultivation arguing that such duties arise from the internal command of reason throughout kant insists on a strict separation between legality and morality while maintaining that both derive from the autonomy of the will this work completes his ethical project by laying out the juridical and ethical structure of human freedom in both public and private life law is the inevitable end of reason and as such is rooted in a priori principles native to the soul but not external experience in other words metaphysical the imperative of virtue relies on inner compulsion while the imperative of legality relies on an external compulsion in his lifelong rage against the empiricism of david hume kant here builds a positive framework devoid of polemics kant's doctrine of right would inspire hegel's 1820 philosophy of right where he would develop a more robust legal theory and a more restrictive social contract

in this book gaven kerr expands on the brief treatment of creation offered in his 2015 volume aquinas's way to god the proof in *de ente et essentia* aquinas does not offer one cohesive treatment on the issue of creation kerr synthesizes discussions from across his works in order to present a unified thomistic metaphysics of creation

metaphysics has shifted ground moving away from necessity and possibility as the lens through which we look at things ted sider shapes the agenda for the subject by exploring how this shift transforms the project of understanding the objects properties and quantities of the universe and the relations between them in terms of structures

individuals a general position of which mathematical structuralism and structural realism are instances which says that scientific and mathematical objects are secondary and the pattern of relations among them is primary and third comparativism about quantities which says that particular values of scientific quantities such as having exactly 1000g mass are secondary and quantitative relations such as being twice as massive as are primary sider concludes these discussions by considering the meta question of when theories are equivalent and how that impacts the debate over structuralism
