like roland barthes victor burgin and susan sontag the essays trace the development of ideas about photography each themed section features an editor s introduction setting ideas and debates in their historical and theoretical context sections include reflections on photography photographic seeing coding and rhetoric photography and the postmodern photo digital documentary and photojournalism the photographic gaze image and identity institutions and contexts

analyses how louise welsh s novels present different labyrinths that characters traverse and get lost in and by the same process with which readers also become engaged in both cases characters and readers discover that the labyrinthine understanding of reality becomes more real than any other official version of reality each chapter of the book explores particular examples of these labyrinths even though they are not linear they tend to intermingle and intertwine

diverse practices the third book in the active landscape photography series presents a set of unique photographic examples for site specific investigations of landscape places contributed by authors across academia practice and photography each chapter serves as a rigorous discussion about photographic methods for the landscape and their underlying concepts chapters also serve as unique case studies about specific projects places and landscape issues project sites include the miller garden olana xx miller prize and the philando castile peace garden landscape places discussed include the archeological landscapes of north peru watery littoral zones the remote white pass in alaska sau paulo and new york city s chinatown photographic image making approaches include the use of lidar repeat photography collage mapping remote image capture portraiture image mining of internet sources visual impact assessment cameraless photography transect walking and interviewing these diverse practices demonstrate how photography when utilized through a set of specific critical methods becomes a rich process for investigating the landscape exploring this concept in relationship to specific contemporary sties and landscape issues reveals the intricacy and subtlety that exists when photography is used actively practitioners academics students and researchers will be inspired by the underlying concepts of these examples and come away with a better understanding about how to create their own rigorous photographic practices

fusing history imagination and the senses anatomy acts explores the social cultural and scientific significance of anatomy in scotland over the past 500 years how have we come to know ourselves through anatomical study how has anatomy changed over the centuries and where is it heading what contribution has scotland made to the culture of anatomy how have the arts responded to the work of anatomists and surgeons the range of anatomy acts is wide setting the high points of renaissance enlightenment and 19th century enquiry

alongside the latest medical imaging techniques and the work of contemporary artists and poets its publication coincides with a touring exhibition of the same name that opens in edinburgh in may 2006 the exhibition draws entirely on scotland s rare and historic medical and art collections there is no comparable visual history of anatomical material from scotland on the market this publication gives a new focus building on the more general overviews of the relationship between art and anatomy that have appeared in recent years essays have been commissioned from leading authorities across medicine and culture selected for their authors specialist knowledge of scottish medical and visual history as well as their original and provocative perspectives on this subject this publication will be of interest to a wide public including professionals and students in medical cultural and historical areas as well as gallery and museum visitors
