links geographic features to gods and beliefs she reconstructs key elements of the *popol vuh* to argue that the three volcanoes around lake atitlan were the three thunderbolt gods and that the lake was the center of the world she also shows that the maya view of the creation of humans is centered on corn and examines core beliefs about the corn cycle to propose that the creation myth was established much earlier in maya history than previously supposed generously illustrated maya sacred geography and the creator deities is a detailed ethnohistorical analysis of maya religion cosmology and ritual practice that convincingly links mythology to the land a comprehensive treatment of maya religion it provides an essential resource for scholars and will fascinate any reader captivated by these ancient beliefs
