language acquisition research is challenging the intricate behavioral and cognitive foundations of speech are difficult to measure objectively the audible components of speech however are quantifiable and thus provide crucial data this practical guide synthesizes the authors decades of experience into a comprehensive set of tools that will allow students and early career researchers in the field to design and conduct rigorous studies that produce reliable and valid speech data and interpretations the authors

thoroughly review specific techniques for obtaining qualitative and quantitative speech data including how to tailor the testing environments for optimal results they explore observational tasks for collecting natural speech and experimental tasks for eliciting specific types of speech language comprehension tasks are also reviewed so researchers can study participants interpretations of speech and conceptualizations of grammar most tasks are oriented towards children but special considerations for infants are also reviewed as well as multilingual children chapters also provide strategies for transcribing and coding raw speech data into reliable data sets that can be scientifically analyzed furthermore they investigate the intricacies of interpretation so that researchers can make empirically sound inferences from their data and avoid common pitfalls that can lead to unscientific conclusions

research in second language acquisition empirical evidence across languages provides an overview of current research within the processability theory framework pienemann 1998 2005 the articles in this volume combine a more theoretical approach in order to further extend the theory and studies utilizing pt to further investigate bilingual language acquisition and language development in natural and institutional settings taking these different aspects into consideration this volume is organised in two parts part 1 second language processing contributions to theory development contains a number of papers discussing the inclusion of further theoretical aspects into pt focusing on english as a second language in part 2 second language grammars across languages pt is applied to a number of typologically different languages and contexts

the handbook of second language acquisition presents an integrated discussion of key and sometimes controversial issues in second language acquisition research discusses the biological and cognitive underpinnings of sla mechanisms processes and constraints on sla the level of ultimate attainment research methods and the status of sla as a cognitive science includes contributions from twenty seven of the world s leading scholars provides an invaluable resource for all students and scholars of human cognition including those in linguistics psychology applied linguistics esl foreign languages and cognitive science

the scope of individual learner differences is broad yet there is no current comprehensive and unified volume that provides an overview of the considerable amount of research conducted on various language learner differences until now

this volume brings together a selection of articles about research conducted on language acquisition in the baltic states namely in latvia and lithuania a field which has witnessed massive growth in recent years the book begins with an introduction which specifies the problems investigated by the contributions in order to acquaint the reader with current

there is a growing interest in second language acquisition sla research in interdisciplinary approaches as that are by theoretical as much as practical need of understanding language learning and performance intellectually second language acquisition research is now a recognised independent field of academic inquiry concerned with cognitive psychological social and pragmatic aspects of the phenomenon of second language development sla research tends to be both highly theoretical and experimental and as such lends itself well to the rigour of scientific research it is in this context that the use of well articulated theories and concepts is increasingly seen as an essential research and thinking tool for understanding and conducting sla research processability theory piemann 1998 is one of the more prominent theories that have been applied across a number of second languages the logic underlying processability theory is that at any stage during the developmental process the learner can produce and comprehend only those target language linguistic forms which the current state of the language processor i e the learner language can handle it is therefore crucial to understand the architecture of the language processor and the way in which it handles second language development the chapters included in this book will report on the various technical and theoretical aspects of experimental sla research across a number of typologically different languages the book includes detailed chapters outlining the key theoretical claims and methodological requirements underpinning this kind of sla research many of the subsequent chapters report processability theory related studies to the wider field of sla research though the emphasis is on cross linguistic experimental research undertaken within the parameters of processability theory the book nevertheless sheds the light on the nexus between bilingualism and theory driven second language acquisition research

developmental research has long focused on regularities in language acquisition minimizing factors that might be responsible for variation although researchers are now increasingly concerned with one or another of these factors this volume brings together

research on three different sources of variation language specific properties the nature of the input to children across contexts and several aspects of the learners themselves chapters explore these sources of variation within an interdisciplinary and comparative approach allaying theories and methodologies stemming from linguistics psycholinguistics developmental psychology and neuroscience the comparative perspective involves different languages contexts of use types of learners first second language acquisition monolingual bilingual learners autism language impairment as well as vocal and visuo gestural communicative modalities co verbal gestures sign language acquisition the volume points to the need to enhance interdisciplinary research using complementary methodologies to further examine sources of variation and to integrate variation into a more general developmental theory

second language acquisition and the critical period hypothesis is the only book on the market to provide a diverse collection of perspectives from experienced researchers on the role of the critical period hypothesis in second language acquisition it is widely believed that age effects in both first and second language acquisition are developmental in nature with native levels of attainment in both to be though possible only if learning began before the closure of a window of opportunity a critical or sensitive period these seven chapters explore this idea at length with each contribution acting as an authoritative look at various domains of inquiry in second language acquisition including syntax morphology phonetics phonology universal grammar and neurofunctional factors by presenting readers with an evenly balanced take on the topic with viewpoints both for and against the critical period hypothesis this book is the ideal guide to understanding this critical body of research in sla for students and researchers in applied linguistics and second language acquisition

the mayan family of languages is ancient and unique with their distinctive relational nouns positionals and complex grammatical voices they are quite alien to english and have never been shown to be genetically related to other new world tongues these qualities clifton pye shows afford a particular opportunity for linguistic insight both an overview of lessons pye has gleaned from more than thirty years of studying how children learn mayan languages as well as a strong case for a novel method of researching crosslinguistic language acquisition more broadly this book demonstrates the value of a close granular analysis of a small language lineage for untangling the complexities of first language acquisition pye here applies the comparative method to three mayan languages k'iche' mam and ch'ol showing how differences in the use of verbs are connected to differences in the subject markers and pronouns used by children and adults his holistic approach allows him to observe how small differences between the languages lead to significant differences in the structure of the children's lexicon and grammar and to learn why that is so more than this he expects that such careful scrutiny of related languages variable solutions to specific problems will yield new insights into how children acquire complex grammars studying such an array of related languages he argues is a necessary condition for understanding how any particular language is used studying languages in isolation comparing them only to one's native tongue is merely collecting linguistic curiosities

this volume addresses salient theoretical issues concerning the validity of research methods in second language acquisition and provides critical analysis of contextualized versus sentence level production approaches the contributors present their views of competence versus performance the nature of language acquisition data research design the relevance of contextualized data collection and interpretation and the desirability of a particularistic nomothetic theoretical paradigm versus more comprehensive consideration of multiple realities and complex influencing factors this book presents varying and
