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this anthology provides an overview of the history and theory of chicano a art from the 1960s to the present emphasizing the debates and vocabularies that have played key roles in its conceptualization in chicano and chicana art which includes many of chicano a art s landmark and foundational texts and manifestos artists curators and cultural critics trace the development of chicano a art from its early role in the chicano civil rights movement to its mainstream acceptance in american art institutions throughout this teaching oriented volume they address a number of themes including the politics of border life public art practices

this is the first book solely dedicated to the history development and present day flowering of chicana and chicano visual arts it offers readers an opportunity to understand and appreciate chicana o art from its beginnings in the 1960s its relationship to the chicana o movement and its leading artists themes current directions and cultural impact the visual arts have both reflected and created chicano culture in the united states for college students and for all readers who want to learn more about this subject this book is an ideal introduction to an art movement with a social conscience book jacket

sanchez's subject is the power of imperial myths and the subversive power unleashed when resistance movements take over those myths for their own purposes moving from John of Patmos's inversion of Roman imperial mythology in Revelation 12 to the indigenous appropriation of Spanish symbolism and mythology drawn from Revelation 12 in 17th century Mexico Sanchez then explores the continuing power of the Virgin of Guadalupe la Guadalupea to inspire movements for a better society in our own day from Patmos to the Barrio reveals new insights into the biblical apocalypse of John and the enduring power of its legacy down to the present day as well as translations of two important 17th century documents concerning la Guadalupea Luis Laso de la Vega's *Hueli Tlamahuiacoltica* and Miguel Sanchez's *Imagen de la Virgen Maria* also included are images of la Guadalupea in the murals of East Los Angeles

century by sharing the voices of those in the trenches educators students community activists and cultural workers who are effectively using multidisciplinary approaches to education this two volume set of contributed essays provides readers with a historical context to the current struggles and attacks on ethnic studies by examining the various cultural and political wars that are making an impact on american educational systems and how students faculty and communities are impacted as a result it investigates specific cases of educational whitewashing and challenges to that whitewashing such as tom horne s attack along with the state board of education against the mexican american studies in the tucson school district the experiences of professors of color teaching ethnic studies in primarily white universities across the united states and the role that student activists play in the movements for ethnic studies in their high schools universities and communities readers will come away with an understanding of the history of ethnic studies in the united states the challenges and barriers that ethnic studies scholars and practitioners currently face and the ways to advocate for the development of ethnic studies within formal and community based spaces
