prolific author and co chair of the mfa design school of visual arts steven heller shares his love of design with the world through essays interviews and profiles design is a living but to live passion is essential for the love of design is an anthology of steven heller s essays that are underscored by the essence that makes designers do what they do whether it is to make the environ a better place or communicate important messages or simply enliven the quotidian world design is everywhere and everything it is a life force made and appreciated with love the focus of the anthology is graphic design and typography but these disciplines impact so many other forms of design that it is impossible to ignore them through essays interviews and profiles heller captures the essence of what makes artists into designers and what makes design and its makers tick from the design director of the new york times discussing how during the pandemic he created the most effective front pages to a collage artist talking about why cutting and pasting scraps of material into dynamic compositions each story and narrative brings to light ambitions and aspirations they are couched in love for the thinking making and doing of design for the love of design is here to show that graphic and other design activities are not just ways of making a living but living a life

one of the pioneers of design studies and still one of its most distinguished practitioners victor margolin here offers a timely meditation on design and its study at the turn of the millennium and charts new directions for the future development of both fields divided into sections on the practice and study of design the essays in the politics of the artificial cover such topics as design history design research design as a political tool sustainable design and the problems of design s relation to advanced technologies margolin also examines the work of key practitioners such as the matrix designer ken isaacs throughout the book margolin demonstrates the underlying connections between the many ways of reflecting on and practicing design he argues for the creation of an international interdisciplinary field of design research and proposes a new

ethical agenda for designers and researchers that encompasses the responsibility to users the problems of sustainability and the complicated questions of how to set boundaries for applying advanced technology to solve the problems of human life

the black experience in design spotlights teaching practices research stories and conversations from a black african diasporic lens excluded from traditional design history and educational canons that heavily favor european modernist influences the work and experiences of black designers have been systematically overlooked in the profession for decades however given the national focus on diversity equity and inclusion in the aftermath of the nationwide black lives matter protests in the united states educators practitioners and students now have the opportunity as well as the social and political momentum to make long term systemic changes in design education research and practice reclaiming the contributions of black designers in the process the black experience in design an anthology centering a range of perspectives spotlights teaching practices research stories and conversations from a black african diasporic lens through the voices represented this text exemplifies the inherently collaborative and multidisciplinary nature of design providing access to ideas and topics for a variety of audiences meeting people as they are and wherever they are in their knowledge about design ultimately the black

experience in design serves as both inspiration and a catalyst for the next generation of creative minds tasked with imagining shaping and designing our future

osgood focuses on major campaigns such as atoms for peace people to people and cultural exchange programs drawing on recently declassified documents that record u s psychological operations in some three dozen countries he tells how u s propaganda agencies presented everyday life in america to the world its citizens living full happy lives in a classless society where economic bounty was shared by all osgood further investigates the ways in which superpower disarmament negotiations were used as propaganda maneuvers in the battle for international public opinion he also reexamines the early years of the space race focusing especially on the challenge to american propagandists posed by the soviet launch of sputnik

based on interviews with over 60 graphic design business owners this volume seeks to cast light on the risks requirements and rewards of running a creative and successful design business
