this volume of critical essays explores various facets of the social sciences and humanities from an interdisciplinary perspective the essays gathered here have been culled from different aspects of humanities research in order to widen the scope of research possibilities the dialogic mode in which the essays are arranged lends a unique texture to the book this volume will be of interest to researchers academics and even the casual reader with an interest in the humanities the rich array of topics covered here gives an inkling of the range of professor milind malshe s research interests and his academic associations in his career as a scholar and mentor the different sections in this volume engage in a performance of sorts allowing a free play of many voices identified as the core to teaching and research in the humanities

the essays in cutting edges examine english satire of the eighteenth century from various theory based postmodern perspectives some examine little known works that postmodern concerns such as the role of women and the problems of authorship have rendered especially interesting others reconsider familiar works in terms of the latest critical issues the justification for these investigations is that both satire and postmodern methods are extremely skeptical and acutely aware that language is always ironic

always pointing to the gap between signifier and signified the approaches in this book include those associated with deconstruction reception theory marxist criticism the new historicism and various feminist criticisms and with such theorists as derrida bakhtin gouxs and luhmann while most of the major figures of eighteenth century satire butler rochester swift pope gay fielding sterne and johnson are represented here so too are many other interesting writers thomas shadwell fannie burney mary davys and elizabeth hamilton to name but a few

a maverick in her own time margaret cavendish duchess of newcastle 1623 1673 was dismissed for three centuries as an eccentric crank yet the past few decades have witnessed a true renaissance in cavendish studies as scholars from diverse academic disciplines produce books articles and theses on every aspect of her oeuvre cavendish s literary creations hold a wide appeal for modern readers because of her talent for thinking outside the rigid box that delimited the hierarchies of class race and gender in seventeenth century europe in so doing she challenged the ultimate building blocks of early modern society whether the tenets of christianity the social and political imperatives of patriarchy or the arrogant claims of the new baconian science at the same time cavendish offers keen insights into current social issues her works have become a springboard for critical discourse on such topics as the nature of gender difference and the role of science in human life sara mendelson s aim in compiling this volume is to convey to readers some idea of the scope and variety of scholarship on cavendish not only in terms of dominant themes but of critical controversies and intriguing new pathways for investigation

until recently anne clifford has been known primarily for her knole diary edited by vita sackville west which recounted her steadfast resistance to the most authoritative figures of her culture including james i as she insisted on her right to inherit her father s title and lands lucy hutchinson was known primarily as the biographer of her husband a puritan leader during the english civil wars the essays collected here examine not only these texts but in clifford s case her architectural restorations and both the great book which she had compiled and the great picture which she commissioned in order to explore the identity she fashioned for herself as a property owner matriarchal head of her family patron and historian in hutchinson s case recent scholars have turned their attention to her poetry her translation of lucretius and her biblical epic order and disorder to analyze her contributions to early modern scientific and political writing and to place her work in relation to milton s paradise lost

this volume includes leading scholarship on five writers active in the first half of the sixteenth century margaret more roper katherine parr anne askew mildred cooke cecil and anne cooke bacon the essays represent a range of theoretical approaches and

provide valuable insights into the religious social economic and political contexts essential for understanding these writers texts scholars examine the significance of margaret more roper s translations and letters in the contexts of humanism family relationships and changing cultural forces the contributions of katherine parr and anne askew to reformation discourses and debates and the material presence of mildred cooke cecil and anne cooke bacon in the intellectual religious and political life of their time the introduction surveys the development of the field as an interdisciplinary project involving literature history classics religion and cultural studies

commentary on his background and his most famous novel native son and his short fiction and later works

each volume in this series provides an introduction tracing the subject author s critical reputation trends in interpretation developments in textual and biographical scholarship and reprints of selected essays and reviews beginning with the author s contemporaries and continuing through to current scholarship many volumes also feature new essays by leading scholars and critics specially commissioned for the series

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
