emphasized the practice of psychology in china is somewhat limited this lack is expressed by the fact that psychologists avoid questions that have political content an examination of the attitudes of chinese is also presented and their views on individuality self criticism violence child rearing religion and modernization are discussed the book is of great importance for scholars and readers who research on the evolution growth and contributions of psychology to society

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
