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the purpose of this book is to examine the performance of guyana s economy during the era of dirigisme and the period of economic liberalisation with emphasis on a market economy using all available micro and macro data in a much broader and meaningful sense this book deals with the socio economic progress of guyana from the 1960s with heavy emphasis on the market reforms because this is the dominant and interesting story for policy lessons in the third world this book also focuses on what has happened to poverty inequality and other social indicators during the reform period until now there has not been any systematic examination of the effects of the economic reforms in guyana on unemployment wages and industrial activity poverty and inequality farmers response to price liberalisation education and health indicators ethnicity and growth and governance crime and corruption these issues and more are the subject matter of this book the book refers to those aspects of guyana s history and recent political events that bear directly on economic policy and the performance of the economic system

summative assessment has been a contentious issue in educational circles for several decades particularly high stakes assessment events which arise at various junctures of the school cycle

especially those at the end of it the french baccalaureat and english a levels and their numerous clones throughout the francophone and anglophone worlds are household names and represent milestone events in people's lives as their outcomes are principal determinants of young people's future prospects these examinations are external they are devised conducted and processed by agencies outside the schools usually ministerial examination units as such they act as blind arbiters of student achievement providing the proverbial level playing field which ensures the comparability of outcomes in the pyramidal school structures of yesteryear examinations acted as filters regulating the progression of pupils to subsequent tiers of formal education exit points occurred from primary school level up from where unsuccessful candidates could enter the labour force and or embark on occupationally specific further education and training with the modernisation of the labour market and an ever higher social demand for access to higher levels of formal education the filtering function of examinations at lower levels of schooling has been gradually eroded while burgeoning numbers of students at the upper secondary level have brought about reforms that include curricular diversification and sometimes radical overhauls of terminating assessment systems including the modification and in some instances abandonment of external examinations this edited volume brings together the experiences of twenty examination systems from around the world to show how these dynamic entities have adapted over time to the changing context of schooling following an introduction by stephen p heyneman of world bank repute there are sixteen chapters presenting country case studies which have been written up under common subheadings thereby highlighting the comparative nature of the work and facilitating cross referencing the subsequent four chapters elaborate on the theme of external examinations beyond national borders including a contribution by the international baccalaureate organisation a defining feature of the work is the attention it pays to what it calls the nuts and bolts of external examinations from question setting to grading procedures these are it is argued instrumental in nurturing and maintaining public confidence in external examinations the book will be of immense value to people involved in educational policy studies especially strategic educational planning as well as those directly concerned with formal assessment the work has been written to appeal to a wide audience of informed persons it is accessible to teachers and interested laypeople as well as to academics

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the present book cases of assessment in mathematics education is one of two studies resulting from an icmi study conference on assessment in mathematics education and its effects the book which is published in the series of icmi studies under the general editorship of the president and secretary of icmi is closely related to another study resulting from the same conference investigations into assessment in mathematics education niss 1992 the two books although originating from the same sources and having the same editor emphasize different aspects of assessment in mathematics education and can be read independently of one another while the present book is devoted to presenting and discussing cases of assessment that are actually implemented the other study attempts to critically analyze general and principal aspects of assessment naturally the content of either book is enriched by the materials and perspectives provided by the other one in order to put this book and its background into context the nature and scope of the icmi studies are outlined briefly below

this anthology presents a comprehensive review of mathematics and its teaching in the following nations in south america central america and the caribbean argentina bolivia brazil chile colombia costa rica cuba guyana haiti honduras méxico panamá paraguay perú puerto rico trinidad and tobago and venezuela the last summary of mathematics education encompassing countries from the southern americas appeared in 1966 progress in the field during five decades has remained unexamined until now

the objective of this report is to focus attention on the performance problems needs and prospects of the fifteen caribbean countries which are members of both the caribbean group for cooperation in economic development and the world bank it provides an overview of overall developments affecting the caribbean countries over the past fifteen years as well as progress achieved during this period the efforts needed to accelerate the implementation of the reform agenda are examined focusing on the conditions needed to achieve macroeconomic stability efforts needed to accelerate privatization trade reform and domestic deregulation and developments regarding the various preferential agreements which benefit the caribbean countries the paper examines the flow of resources to the caribbean countries since 1978 and relates it to the process of adjustment and growth during this period and to the efforts required to strengthen this process during the 1990s it also presents estimates of assistance needed during 1992 93 the report evaluates the stock of human resources indicates the incidence of poverty assesses the positive and negative factors affecting human resource development regional policy options and highlights the human resource development issues for the 1990s the ecosystems in the caribbean countries are also described
