this book enriches the discourse around global citizenship education in teacher education through the example of a teacher s experience in a canada china sister school reciprocal learning landscape instead of positioning global citizenship teaching and learning as a set of fixed goals to be attained by teachers alone this book approaches global citizenship teaching and learning as unfinished lifework in progress and as situated curriculum problems to be inquired together by university researchers school teachers and students under the spirit of reciprocity and community this reimagination of narratives theory and action start from collaborative and reciprocal learning partnerships among chinese and canadian researchers and teachers in the practicality of re searching and re enacting the purpose and meanings of twenty first century education in a canada china sister school setting

the variety of land questions facing africa and the divergent strategies proposed to resolve them continue to evoke debates increasingly in response to the enduring problems of land tenure there are land movements of all shapes and orientations some reformist and others quite revolutionary in their agenda however revolutionary land movements have tended to ignore the land tenure interests of women pastoralists youth and indigenous people several of these longstanding and emerging issues in land tenure include the role of the state in land tenure reforms urban land questions the nature of land struggles and improvements and the impact of land tenure developments on particular social groups and countries an overarching concern is the extent to which land rights are being commodified through the conversion of land held under customary tenure systems into marketised systems the consequences of this include growing land concentration land tenure insecurities diminishing access to land by various sections of society including the poor women and less dominant ethno religious groups this volume brings together different studies on africa s land questions exploring emerging land issues on the continent in terms of the wider questions of development citizenship and democratisation the chapters discuss the land question through a variety of themes some focus on the agrarian aspects of the land questions while others elucidate the urban dimensions of the land question

hundreds of thousands of people living in africa find themselves non persons in the only state they have ever known because they are not recognised as citizens they cannot get their children registered at birth or entered in school or university they cannot access state health services

they cannot obtain travel documents or employment without a work permit and if they leave the country they may not be able to return most of all they cannot vote stand for office or work for state institutions ultimately such policies can lead to economic and political disaster or even war the conflicts in both cote d ivoire and the democratic republic of congo have had at their hearts the very right of one part of the national population to share with others on equal terms the rights and duties of citizenship this book brings together new material from across africa of the most egregious examples of citizenship discrimination and makes the case for urgent reform of the law

this text supports student teachers nqts and practitioners in implementing the citizenship order in secondary schools to be introduced in september 2002 with a practical clear focus the authors provide an intellectual challenge argument and evidence to help the reader come to an informed view on the complex and controversial issues in each chapter well focused examples and strategies for use in the classroom

citizenship can be defined simply as being a member of political institutions citizenship the first evidence of which is encountered in ancient greek city states in history is found in the roman state constitutionally for the first time national citizenship which became more important with the importance of nation states was supported by the concept of human rights after the french revolution events and phenomena such as reform industrialization democracy globalization digitalization international trade and migration have given different dimensions to the concept of citizenship today all states have determined the rights and duties of individuals as their citizens in their constitutions and convey the rights and responsibilities of citizenship to the students in school education societies with good citizens who know their rights and responsibilities are thought to develop and advance more in any area
