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captures the essence of pivotal events and individuals in nursing history replete with concise and easy to read information this resource captures the essence of pivotal events and individuals in nursing history who have driven the evolution of the nursing role from that of a handmaiden to a key health professional it distills important historical information often neglected in today's nursing programs that fosters an understanding and appreciation of the issues that inform nursing practice today content is presented in an easy access format consisting of short summaries and fast facts in a nutshell that identify key points throughout each chapter an introductory chapter featuring an interview with a prominent nursing historian adds breadth and color to this review of nursing through the ages incorporating a global perspective each chapter highlights significant events during a particular era as they affected the status of the nursing profession and the nursing role beginning with the pre nightingale period the book addresses the role of the nurse before the advent of formal training programs it continues with the contributions of Florence Nightingale the early 1900s and new developments in nursing including public health nursing and the impact of both world wars the bulk of the book comprises an in depth account of the tremendous growth and professional development in nursing during the past 100 years addressing nursing theories and leaders education research professional organizations and the future of nursing key features provides important historical content often

neglected in today's nursing programs delivers concise easy to read information about important events and influential nursing luminaries describes how nurses have influenced health and wellness across the life span highlights key points with fast facts in a nutshell boxes includes an interview with the president of the American Association for the History of Nursing a chapter on the relevance of nursing history by a noted nurse historian and a chapter on influential nurses in our history by a noted nursing leader and educator

the nursing profession is the largest health care occupation with more than 2 million jobs it is also one of the 10 occupations projected to have the largest numbers of new jobs licensed practical nurse training lasts about one year and is available in about 1 100 state approved programs mostly in vocational or technical schools nursing homes are expected to offer the most new jobs job seekers in hospitals may face competition as the number of hospital jobs for LPNs declines job prospects for nursing and home health aides will also be very good because of fast growth and high replacement needs in these large occupations minimum education or training is generally required for entry level jobs but earnings are low this book brings together a detailed description of the profession including the educational requirements as well as what can be expected upon entering the profession present and future issues in the field as well are also examined and a selective bibliography is included on books and journals of particular interest to newcomers to the field

this textbook draws on international contributors with a range of backgrounds to explore engage with and challenge readers in understanding the many aspects and elements that inform and influence contemporary nursing practice with a focus to the future this book explores the challenges facing health services and presents the arguments for a nursing contribution and influence in ensuring safe and quality care readers are supported to explore how as individuals they can shape their personal nursing identity and practice the structure of the text is based on the belief that an individual nurse's professional identity is developed through an interaction between their personal attributes and the influences of the profession itself reflecting this approach the authors engage in a conversation with the reader rather than simply presenting a series of facts and information organized around a series of topical and pertinent questions and drawing on perspectives from policy education and practice the book explores a diverse range of

topics such as how historical and popular media representations of nursing hold back nursing practice today the opportunities presented through education and nursing role development to increase the nursing contribution to health services the economic and political influences on nursing and health care how the professional regulation of nurses and core values informs your practice ways to define and develop your own strong nursing identity central chapter questions provide ideal triggers for group discussions in class or online and equally as discussion topics between colleagues to support ongoing professional development there is an emphasis throughout nurses and nursing on challenging thinking to recast nursing practice for the future by encouraging the reader to explore and create their emerging nursing identity or re examine previously long held views this text supports the reader to better understand health care nursing and most importantly themselves as nurses
