developmental research has long focused on regularities in language acquisition minimizing factors that might be responsible for variation although researchers are now increasingly concerned with one or another of these factors this volume brings together research on three different sources of variation language specific properties the nature of the input to children across contexts and several aspects of the learners themselves chapters explore these sources of variation within an interdisciplinary and comparative

it has long been established that bilingual speakers are rarely balanced in their languages so that one language is dominant the contributions to the research topic bilingual language development the role of dominance focus on the potential effects of language dominance on the competence and processing of bilinguals covering a large variety of language combinations and domains important aspects of such work are the interplay of l1 maintenance attrition and possible l2 dominance the direction of cross linguistic influence cli or code mixing as well as the effects of bilingualism on cognitive development each addressed in several contributions however such research presupposes a definition of dominance which is far from being settled this gives rise to considerable differences in the operationalization of the concept across studies the studies in this research topic present a multifaceted picture of the role of language dominance for l1 maintenance attrition l2 development and cli though a unified story cannot emerge for such a complex subject interesting new venues are explored including the impact of dominance shift during l1 re exposure comparisons of different types of bilingual groups or operationalization of dominance through experiential measures the variety of approaches and results is in part owed to the many language combinations studied and the fact that bilingual children adults and atypical speakers are investigated this diversity constitutes the interest of this research topic

seminar paper from the year 2006 in the subject english language and literature studies linguistics grade 2 university of marburg fremdsprachliche philologien course proseminar phonology language english abstract the changes in phonological development during the first two years of life will be discussed in this term paper the research concentrates on whether the first sounds produced by a young child attach to general rules and what characterizes language of a two year old a comparison of articulatory abilities of two different periods shows the progress in childish first language acquisition concerning word utterances and pronunciation at first the basic conditions for learning a language in general are explained it follows a detailed study of the phonological development of children with regard to german phonology that is intended to discover the relation between babble and speech

this volume brings together a number of papers dealing with various aspects of the study of language acquisition and language learning the intention is to overcome barriers imposed by restrictions in the accessibility of both publishing sources journals conference reports

working papers as well as languages therefore all papers are in english those originally written in german have been translated the papers originated between 1970 and 1980 they derive from long term investigations which began 1968 at the university of freiburg and which were continued since 1969 at the university of kiel the essential theme is the nature of man s language learning system i e the ability which allows human beings to learn and to be taught natural languages this ability is unique to human beings it is species specific and very likely biologically endowed i e innate one of the major concerns throughout these papers is to show that learning a foreign language in the classroom via foreign language teaching is by no means totally different from mastering a language in natural situations foreign language teaching must be integrated into a comprehensive view of language learning which includes all types of language acquisition

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
