the practical importance of an alternate view that learning is synonymous with a change in the meaning of experience they develop their theory of the conceptual nature of knowledge and describe classroom tested strategies for helping students to construct new and more powerful meanings and to integrate thinking feeling and acting in their research they have found consistently that standard educational practices that do not lead learners to grasp the meaning of tasks usually fail to give them confidence in their abilities it is necessary to understand why and how new information is related to what one already knows all those concerned with the improvement of education will find something of interest in learning how to learn
