toni morrison winner of the 1993 nobel prize in literature reads the speech she delivered in stockholm sweden at the nobel prize award ceremony

word frequency plays a prominent role in many scientific and applicational fields the book presents innovative methods in research and new results important for language and text characterization based on a general theory

toni morrison s speech given at the nobel prize ceremony in stockholm in december 1993 is a profound meditation on language and our responsibility towards it she weaves her thoughts around a folk tale which compares language with a fragile bird a living being which can be paralysed or deadened by misuse she attacks the obscuring language of the state the vacuous soundbite language of the media the rigid limiting language of academia and science it is an inspiring and bold statement moving allusive and powerful
