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this book uses data collected from in depth interviews with young people over the course of a year to explore the complex role of social media in their lives and the part it plays in shaping how they understand and present their identity to a broad public on a wide array of platforms using this data the book proposes and develops a new theoretical framework for understanding identity performances comic theory detailed in this book centres on a consideration of the role of social media design in shaping identity and explores the ways in which socio culturally grounded users engage in acts of compromise novelty and negotiation with social media designs and digital technologies to produce unique identity performances positioned within the field of educational research this book overtly challenges assumptions and myths about the internet as a neutral source of knowledge instead exploring the way in which designs and technologies shape who we interact with and how we understand what it is to be social moving beyond the over used digital natives paradigm this book makes a clear case that educators and education researchers need to move beyond a focus on coding and digital skills alone highlighting the pressing need to take explicit account of the overlaps between digital technology culture and education

language is integral to the construction of personal socio cultural and socio political identities language identity and symbolic culture closely investigates the relationship between language and identities offering a comprehensive yet progressive view of how linguistics relates to development and education both in theoretical and real world applications progressing from a theoretical core examining the connection between language and individual identity this book moves on to look at the wider socio political discourse involving the marginalization and resistance of communities in the world beginning with the philosophical paradigms of language evans questions whether language shapes personal identities in its daily use or whether language is simply a tool for describing rather than creating the world extrapolating on this the contributors utilise case studies from across the globe to see how these linguistic perspectives are played out in the real world considering the role of language in issues surrounding power colonization marginalization and education language identity and symbolic culture offers a view of language identity conflicts around the world and an understanding of the opportunities of political and cultural emancipation created through language and open discourse

at present western european societies are at the same time facing the aftermath of massive immigration movements and the challenges of new globalization waves education is at the heart of this twofold experience on the one hand it is confronted with the demand of developing a canon for national identity construction on the other hand it is held responsible for the pupils emancipation in a globalizing society as a consequence teachers and pupils are challenged to deal with identity issues in their everyday classroom realities in politics the media and the educational field much has been said and done regarding immigrant minority pupils identities and their socio cultural and linguistic integration still little is known about how identities are actually constructed and developed in the discourses of those who make up the primary school classroom this book reports on two ethnographic case studies carried out in multicultural classrooms in a dutch and flemish primary school it portrays the discourses and the interactions class teachers and their twelve year old pupils are engaged in on a daily basis in depth analyses are presented of the institutional discourses which the classrooms are part of and of the teachers and pupils discourses and their mutual relationships in both classrooms the analysis shows that pupils identities are constructed by the institutions and their teachers on the basis of their language behaviour and their presupposed belonging to a homogeneous cultural and or religious group the analysis at the same time makes clear that teachers have started questioning their understanding of immigrant minority pupils identities it further shows that the pupils under investigation are by no means passive objects of identity ascription rather they appear as active and capable multilingual and multicultural stockbrokers ready and willing to invest in the linguistic and cultural currency that ensures the highest return on investment
